To Parents/Guardians/Carers naming Aquinas Diocesan Grammar School as a preference on their child's Online Transfer Application.

Under normal circumstances, Aquinas Diocesan Grammar School will give preference to, (apart from those who qualify for either the Special Circumstances or Special Provision procedures), those applicants awarded a <u>grade and SAS</u> by GL in completing the GL Entrance Assessment or the Supplementary GL Entrance Assessment.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and following Public Health restrictions, the GL Entrance Assessment and Supplementary GL Entrance Assessment have been cancelled this year. Consequently, in these exceptional circumstances and for this year only, our normal entrance criteria have been amended to reflect this.

Parents/guardians/carers whose children wish to apply for a Year 8 place in Aquinas Diocesan Grammar School, should still do so through the normal post primary admissions process as set out by the Education Authority.

# RESPECTIVE FUNCTIONS OF THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS AND PRINCIPAL IN RELATION TO ADMISSIONS TO THE SCHOOL

The Board of Governors draws up the admissions criteria and delegates to an Admissions Sub-Committee, which includes the Principal, the responsibility for applying these criteria. Any reference herein to the term the Board of Governors includes any Committee or Sub-Committee appointed by the Board of Governors for the purposes of applying the Admission criteria set out herein.

# **CAPITAL FEE**

From September 1993 parents of all pupils admitted to Aquinas Diocesan Grammar School (except in the case of pupils who are not resident in Northern Ireland and who are non E.C. nationals) have not been required to pay Tuition Fees. A Voluntary Contribution (currently £130 per pupil for the eldest family member, then £100 for any additional child) is requested.

# ADMISSIONS CRITERIA FOR ENTRY OF PUPILS TO YEAR 8 IN SEPTEMBER 2021

Aquinas Diocesan Grammar School will initially consider only those applicants who were registered to take the GL Entrance Assessment. A copy of the GL Registration Card must be uploaded to the On-line Transfer Application.

The Board of Governors will not use as a criterion the position of preference given to Aquinas on the Transfer Application i.e., an applicant who has chosen Aquinas Diocesan Grammar School in any position on the Transfer Application will be considered equally with those who have put Aquinas first.

**Note:** It is the sole responsibility of the parent/guardian/carer of a prospective pupil to ensure that there is submitted, either on the Transfer Application or together with the Transfer Application, all the information required to enable the Board of Governors to apply the Admissions Criteria of Aquinas to the application of the prospective pupil. Only evidence submitted either on the Transfer Application or uploaded with the Transfer Application at the time of submission to Aquinas for admission shall be considered by the Board of Governors in the allocation of a place to the applicant.

# **Special Provisions**

Special Provisions will only apply to children who have not entered for the GL because they took up residence in Northern Ireland after 16 October 2020 or received more than half of their primary education outside Northern Ireland.

Parents/guardians who wish to apply to the School under Special Provisions should complete Form SP20, obtainable from the School or its website <a href="https://www.aquinasgrammar.com">www.aquinasgrammar.com</a>, stating the precise reason why they believe the child is eligible for consideration under Special Provisions and upload it with appropriate evidence with the Transfer Application.

Parents/Guardians who are applying for Special Provisions must do so by **Tuesday 16 March 2021**. Using the information provided, the Board of Governors will determine whether Special Provisions applies. If it does, **those children who the Board of Governors considers to be eligible will be considered under the Admissions Criteria below.** 

After this date, claims for Special Provision should be made directly to Aquinas Diocesan Grammar School, and parents should notify the Education Authority's School Admissions Team. The final date for receipt of new applications/additional information is **Monday**, **12 April 2021**, **no later than 4pm**.

#### **ALLOCATION OF PLACES**

Preference will be given to applicants resident in Northern Ireland at the time of their proposed admission before any applicant who is not resident in Northern Ireland.

In order to determine which pupils will be accepted into Year 8 the following criteria will be applied in the order set down:

- (1) Priority will be given to those applicants who registered to take the GL Entrance Assessment. A copy of the GL Registration Card must be uploaded to the On-line Transfer Application
- (2) In the event of there being more applicants than places available, priority will be given in descending order to those who indicate on the Transfer Application that they:
  - a have a sibling in the school. Siblings are children who, at the date of their application, have a child of the family currently enrolled in Aquinas. (Please name the sibling).
  - b are applicants who are the eldest child in the family or the eldest child at the date of application, eligible to transfer to a mainstream Post-Primary school, or the only child. This is subject to satisfying verification requirements as set out below: [Twins or other multiples will be treated as joint eldest]

The verifying letter must be uploaded with the Transfer Application and state that the child is the eldest and that the child and family are known to the verifier. It must be written on headed notepaper and signed by one of the following who is not a member of the applicant's family:

- i. a medical practitioner
- ii. a solicitor
- iii. a clergyman or equivalent
- iv. a primary school principal
- c Priority will be given to applicants if they are enrolled pupils in the following feeder primary schools in no specific order: St. Anne's PS BT10 ONE; St Bernard's PS, BT6 OJS; St Bride's PS, BT9 6FP; Holy Rosary PS, BT7 3DB; St Ita's PS, BT8 6YY; St Joseph's PS, BT8 8EX; St Malachy's PS, BT7 2BJ; St Matthew's PS, BT5 4EW; St Michael's PS, BT6 OBW.

- Applicants will be selected if they are entitled to Free School Meals. 'Entitled to Free School Meals' will mean applicants who are listed on the Education Authority register and who are entitled to Free School Meals at the date on which their parent or guardian has submitted their post-primary Transfer Application. Should family circumstances change after completion of the Transfer Form it is essential that parents/ guardians inform the Education Authority before <a href="#page-12">12 April 2021</a> no later than 4 p.m.
- e If after consideration of the above criteria, there remain more applicants than places available, applicants will be ranked for acceptance on the basis of a computer-based process which will make use of the names of applicants as shown on their Transfer Applications.

The process is carried out by means of a computer program which, for each applicant, generates a ranking number using the details from the Transfer Application as the seed for a random number generator. The outcome, for any given applicant, is dependent only on the applicant's name (as submitted on the Transfer Application) and is not affected by the details of any other applicant. Although the process is repeatable, and the results may therefore be subsequently verified, it is not possible to predict, in advance of running the program, what the result will be for any given set of details. Applicants with the lowest ranking numbers will be given places up to the number of places available. This will be overseen by the Admissions Sub Committee of the Board of Governors.

When considering which children should be selected for admission, the Board of Governors will only take into account information which is detailed on the Transfer Application. Parents should ensure that all information pertaining to their child and relevant to the school's admissions criteria is uploaded with the Transfer Application.

# **WAITING LIST POLICY**

Should a vacancy arise after 18 June 2021 all applications for admission to Year 8 that were initially refused, new applications and applications where new information has been provided will be treated equally and the published criteria above will be applied. This waiting list will be in place until 30 June 2022. The school will contact you in writing if your child gains a place in the school by this method.

Your child's name will be automatically added to the list. Please contact the school if you wish for your child's name to be removed from the list.
